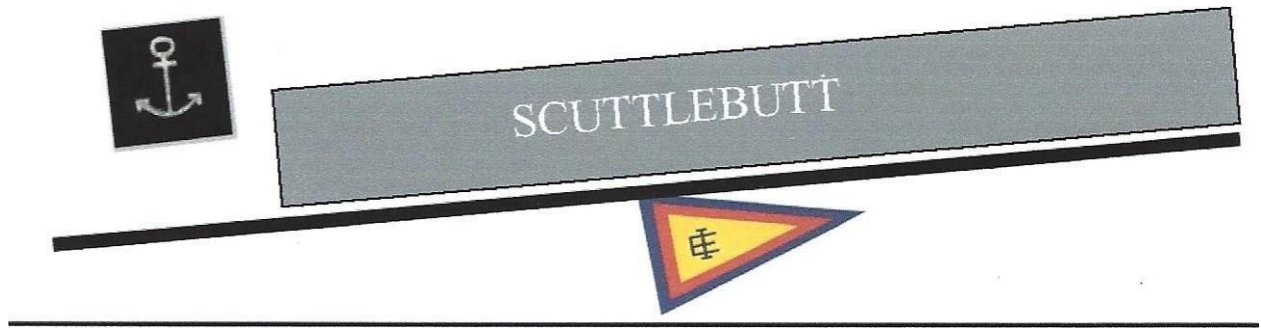

March Event—40's Canteen Party

On Saturday, March 24th the IEYC held its first 1940's USO Canteen Dance and Party at the Brookfield Clubhouse in Clearwater, hosted by Angie and Gene Traupman. Thirty-eight members and guests enjoyed a full evening of fun that included a vintage radio show, a sing-along tribute to the five military branches, a swing dance lesson, a trivia contest, and a best-dressed male and female competition, all with a backdrop of the great big band music of the 40's, provided by DJ San of Swing Time. A Sonny's BBQ dinner started off the evening, followed by a 1949 radio show comedy episode of "The Bickersons", performed admirably by Mary Reinhardt and Arnie Shal, with last minute "volunteer radio actor" Paul Lightfoot. Scott Sanders provided the WWII-era public service announcement, warning everyone that they should not use their car unnecessarily and burn valuable gasoline, because "When you ride alone, Hitler rides with you!" After the sing-along tribute to those who served in the military, Angie and Gene Traupman got (almost) everyone up for an East Coast Swing dance lesson. Excellent participation! It was great to see
